#### **Forecast Discussion**

Clear skies and light winds will allow temperatures to drop below zero this morning. Clouds return before midday as another Alberta Clipper moves towards the region. The storm will redevelop off the New Jersey coast tonight and head east-northeastward, quickly strengthening into a powerful storm as it passes south and east of Nantucket. Heavy snow and strong winds are likely from late Saturday into Sunday afternoon. Right now, it looks like 7-14 inches of powdery snow is expected, but significant blowing and drifting is likely. The heaviest snow is likely remain east of the region, but a slight westward shift in the track of the storm could bring that heavier snow into the area. Skies clear out Sunday night as the storm pulls away, but winds remain strong, with blowing and drifting snow likely into Monday morning.
