A storm system located off the Mid-Atlantic coast will move off to the northeast this afternoon giving the region a glancing blow. Dry air is in place with dew points at or below zero across Northern Massachusetts and Southern New Hampshire and this dry air will continue to deflect the storm to our south. Just some light flurries or snow showers are expected across both northern MA and southern NH with very little accumulation expected.

Additional snow showers are possible Wednesday afternoon and especially during the day on Thursday as a trough of low pressure linger offshore in the Gulf of Maine.

High pressure should control the weather through much of Friday and part of Saturday.

Forecast

Rest of today: Cloudy with scattered flurries, perhaps a dusting, highs around 15. Winds northeast at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Cloudy with flurries or a few snow showers, lows around 5 above, calm winds. A dusting possible overnight.

Tomorrow: Varying amounts of clouds and sun, a few flurries or snow showers possible, highs near 20. Winds light and variable. A dusting possible.

Tomorrow night: Partly to mostly cloudy, chance of flurries, lows in the single digits

Thursday: Variably cloudy, snow showers possible, a coating possible, highs around 15.
